Caspar, Balthasar, and Melchior), but also for a prayer, *Christus benedicat mansionem*, 'May Christ bless this house', which we should say as we inscribe the numbers and letters.

The Forty Days of Christmastide

Please remember that Christmastide lasts not just for twelve days, up to the Epiphany and Baptism of Our Lord, but traditionally all the way to Candlemas on 2nd February. As the carol says, 'Make we mirth for Christ's birth, and *sing we Yule till Candlemas*'. We shall keep the Crib up, as they do in Rome and at Westminster Cathedral, till then. So please remember to pray to the Divine Infant Jesus at the Crib throughout this holy season of forty days.

We are blessed to have a relic of the Manger, which will be exposed for veneration as part of the Crib. A more complete relic of the Manger is preserved at the basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore in Rome.
